1. Call to Order  
Mayor Bennett called the meeting order at 4:30pm. Council persons present: Christian, Clark, Hampton, Holmes, and Rodgers.
2. Open Forum

3. Consideration/Approval of Request #5 for State Revolving Fund in the amount of \$21,104.83  
Gibbs presented a request for the fifth disbursement of the state revolving loan for planning and design fees for the lagoon project. Motion to approve request #5 for State Revolving Fund in the amount of \$21,104.83 made by Christian. Seconded by Hampton. Ayes: Christian, Clark, Hampton, Holmes, and Rodgers. Nays: none. Motion carries.
4. Consideration/Approval of Grant Application to the Wayne Community Foundation  
Gibbs, Christian and Clark provided an overview of a grant that could be submitted to The Wayne Community Foundation. The proposal would be to revitalize the interior of the Walden Park Community Building. The purpose would be to create a more up to date space for those who rent the building for celebrations and reunions, but also to encourage more diverse use of the building for local artist displays, education and training, and cultural events. The updates to the building would include new kitchen appliances, refacing of the kitchen cabinets, refresh paint through out the building, new interior doors, flooring, window coverings, and LED lights. The project would also add smart TVs and WiFi service to the building for use with educational and training events.  
Motion to approve a grant application to the Wayne Community Foundation (WCF) for Upgrades to the Walden Park Community Building up to \$40,000 made by Holmes. Seconded by Hampton. Ayes: Christian, Clark, Hampton, and Holmes. Nays: none. Rodgers abstains due to her role with the WCF. Motion carries.
5. FY 2023 Budget Work Session  
The Council reviewed a draft version of the FY23 budget. Discussion regarding the Max Levy and specific line items on the proposed budget were discussed. Gibbs will make corrections and prepare a new draft for consideration. The public hearing for FY23 Max Levy is scheduled for February 09. If approved, Council will set the public hearing date for the FY23 budget.
6. Good Cause  
Bennett and Holmes reported on a meeting with Hall Engineering regarding plans for street resurfacing this summer. They also discussed future plans for the water tower. There are concerns regarding the tower's age and capacity. Hall Engineering will prepare a proposal for a preliminary engineering report for Council consideration that would provide information regarding a potential new tower.
